

North East Fort Lupton – Community Forum

Anadarko Petroleum Corporation hosted a Community Forum at the Fort Lupton Recreation Center on June 22, 2015, from 4 to 7 p.m. The gathering was hosted in anticipation of Anadarko's new development activity in and around Fort Lupton. This event was the first in a series of proactive engagement opportunities for the community to meet one-on-one with Anadarko employees to learn more about oil and natural gas development plans in the area. Catering was provided by Fort Lupton's own Wholly Stromboli.



More than 300 residents near the first phase of development in North East Fort Lupton (County Road 16 and County Road 18, East of Highway 85) were invited to attend, and 25 Anadarko subject-matter experts were available at the forum to listen to the community's feedback, share information and discuss the first phase of planned activity in North East Fort Lupton. Additionally, a virtual 3D model integrated with Google Earth enabled the attendees to view a simulation of what the drilling phase will look like from their property. Operations on seven pads in North East Fort Lupton began in June. Anadarko expects the drilling phase of development in the area to last through the end of 2015.



Primary questions from attendees were regarding temporary impacts from operations, such as noise, light and dust. Members of the Anadarko team addressed these questions and concerns by discussing plans to install straw bales, as appropriate, at each pad to reduce noise and light impacts. Team members also discussed additional proactive measures taken to reduce dust. Many attendees expressed their gratitude for Anadarko hosting an event for the community. A few attendees requested more specific details

about Anadarko's planned operations to be shared, such as well count and traffic routes. This feedback will be taken in consideration for the next community event hosted in Fort Lupton. A reporter from the Lost Creek Guide attended the event and provided a [write up](#) in the July 1, 2015, edition. The Lost Creek Guide distributes papers to more than 15,000 homes and businesses in South Weld County.
